



Farmers' Workshop at Devanahalli on Safe Reuse



CDD Society conducted a training programme for farmers on “Safe Reuse Practices of Human Waste and Wastewater in Agriculture” at Gurubhavan, Devanahalli on 4th April, 2017. 37 farmers participated in this training and gave very good responses to the team. The participants showed keen interest in the subject addressed in the sessions, posed many questions and comments, and repeatedly voiced their interest to use dried sludge and wastewater in farming.

Workshops on Hygiene and Household Waste Management



During the month of April, CDD Society conducted six workshops on hygiene and household waste management in different wards of Devanahalli Town. As the target audience of these workshops are primarily women and girls, menstrual hygiene is discussed in addition to more general hygiene measures, such as effective washing of hands. Another central aspect of the training is the adequate separation and disposal of household waste to protect both human health and the environment. In the month of April alone, 220 women and girls participated in the trainings in Devanahalli.
